Artwork Descriptions

A. 'In Another Life'

"This piece, "In Another Life" was actually the very first painting I've ever created and I dedicate it to my family, The Gilera's. The fish symbolism was inspired by the movie, Everything Everywhere All At Once..."

B. 'Mill Creek Blue'

"An energetic reflection of the changing seasons, from Mill Creek Ravine in Edmonton. In my work, my goal is to flip the gaze of the traditional landscape and let nature stare back at us..."

C. 'Midnight Bloom'

"Midnight Bloom is an acrylic painting of a Sunflower that represents growth and beauty that is set in a residential area. We may pass the sunflower as a common scene during summer, so I chose to change the colours to give a twist..."

D. 'Tropical Birds, Guava, and Hibiscus'

"This image depicts all the birds that have been in my life since I came to Canada. The guava and hibiscus flowers are my two memories I recall from my home in El Salvador."

E. 'Observer'

"In this piece, the main figure is an observer of the city around them. Contrary to the idea that observers are passive, their expression communicates analytical thinking and responsiveness..."

F. 'Zen Bunny'

"This piece depicts a whimsical character in a dynamic pose. Their body moves in a rhythmic fashion, mirroring the motif around them. It offers a playful interpretation of wavelengths, as it is displayed within an electrical box."

G. 'Forest'

"This is a digital illustration made for a paper presented during the Royce Harder Psychology Conference. It was created in conjunction with a psychology student to convey the importance of emotions and practicing mindfulness with children. We came up with the concept of using the forest as a metaphor for feelings..."

H. 'Ayahuasca'

"This is a painting I made to represent Ayahuasca, a very popular tea in Brazil and which brings a unique experience to those who drink it. This practice comes from the culture of a local Indigenous tribe, the Yawanawas."

I. 'Sunflora'




